



Suggested List of Items to Pack

Three bags per rider:

Duffel bag (clothes and gear)
Sleeping bag
Tent and small tarp.

Suggested Packing List:

Rain Gear	Swimsuit & water shoes (bathing in creeks)
Canteen	Towels or wet ones
Warm Jacket	Shoes for riding, and camp shoes
Sunscreen	Chapstick
Sunglasses	Insect repellent for rider and horse
Camera	Film and extra batteries
Halter & Lead Rope	Nose bag (for feeding grain)
Saddlebags	Portable water bucket for horse
Mole Skin	Cash for cold beverages and Souvenirs
Flashlight	Headlamp with extra batteries.
First Aid Kit	All necessary Prescription Medications
Electrolytes	Dress clothes for banquet

Please consult with your doctor before taking on such a rigorous venture if you have a heart condition, emphysema, or other health problems. Remember we are riding and camping in remote areas many miles from civilization. Bring an adequate supply of necessary medications. Limited first aid will be available.

Please use good judgement in deciding whether or not your horse is conditioned to do this ride. We climb from altitudes of 4200 feet to 9000 feet over rough and rocky terrain. Horses unaccustomed to being ridden 8 hours each day for 6 days may develop medical problems. If you do not feel your horse is suitable for this ride, please see the list of horse rentals.
