

## *Welcome, Trail Rider:*

The **nineteenth** Outlaw Trail Ride through the Outlaw Country of Wyoming has been scheduled for August 1-7, 2010. We will ride in the spectacular southern Big Horn Mountains with elevations covering 4,200 to 9,000 feet. The ride lopes along mountain trails, across streams, and through canyons.

The ride only accepts up to 100 riders which are divided into four groups. We will ride from 15-20 miles each day for 6 days. That means 6-9 hours in the saddle. There will be three different campsites. You will be responsible for setting up and taking down your tent and camp for each new campsite.

There is nightly campfire entertainment with lots of history tales, story telling, music, singing, and fun. If you have musical talent, don't be shy and join right in. On Wednesday night there will be a live band, dance floor, and dancing. Our food is catered, serving a full western breakfast, sack lunches, and big delicious dinners. Our Four-Wheeled Saloon will have beer, soda, juice, Gatorade, and bottled water for sale so you can enjoy a "long, cold one" after the daily ride.

The rider's fee **includes** food and lodging for your horse at the fairgrounds. A picket line will be available beginning July 31<sup>st</sup> and after the ride through the morning of August 8<sup>th</sup>. The orientation dinner is Sunday August 1<sup>st</sup>. The fee also includes breakfast the next morning, three meals a day on the trail for the riders; and water, hay, and grain for the horses; nightly entertainment, and admission to the End of the Trail Banquet on Saturday, August 7<sup>th</sup>.

A more detailed information packet will be mailed to you upon receipt of your application, fee, and signed assumption of risk. Please read all the information carefully.

So become an outlaw for a week and enjoy the greatest, most memorable adventure of a lifetime. See the great beauty and unsurpassed scenery of Outlaw County and ride the trails that Butch, Sundance, Big-Nose George, Elzy Lay and others rode. "*Ride like you mean it.*"
